There are a few things you need to know first...

The National Disability Insurance Scheme, called the NDIS, is for eligible people with a disability – including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people – to choose the supports they need from their own community.

The people and businesses that provide supports, therapies and activities are called NDIS service providers. This is important for you to know.

People living with a disability are missing out because there are not enough NDIS service providers to provide these services in your community.

You could be that person or have the business they need to change that!

Are you already caring for a family member or friend? Are you providing support to someone? Do you have a business or idea that would be a good fit in the NDIS? Are you interested to know more about starting your own business?

In May and June, qualified Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander business trainers are coming to locations throughout Queensland to deliver NDIS business development seminars.

These seminars are good because you will learn:

- About the NDIS and being a provider.
- How to build and grow your own business.
- How to take your business into the NDIS and if it's the right fit.
- Help your mob to get the support they need in their community.

Our trainers know about culture, business, and NDIS. And after you come to a seminar you will have access to mentoring time with them.
